How to Enroll Children in H.C.S.

Hillsdale Community Schools is still accepting new registrations for 2023/2024 Kindergarten and Preschool classes. Any child who will turn **four (4) by December 1, 2023**, is eligible for our high-quality, kindergarten-readiness preschool program at the Bailey Early Childhood Center. Interested families can call Bailey at 517-437-7369 for more information.

Any child who will turn **five (5) by December 1, 2023**, is eligible for the kindergarten program. Two different kindergarten options are available to families; the district supports traditional and developmental kindergarten classrooms. Families interested in gathering more information or enrolling their student in one of the kindergarten classes can contact Gier at 517-437-7347 for more details.
